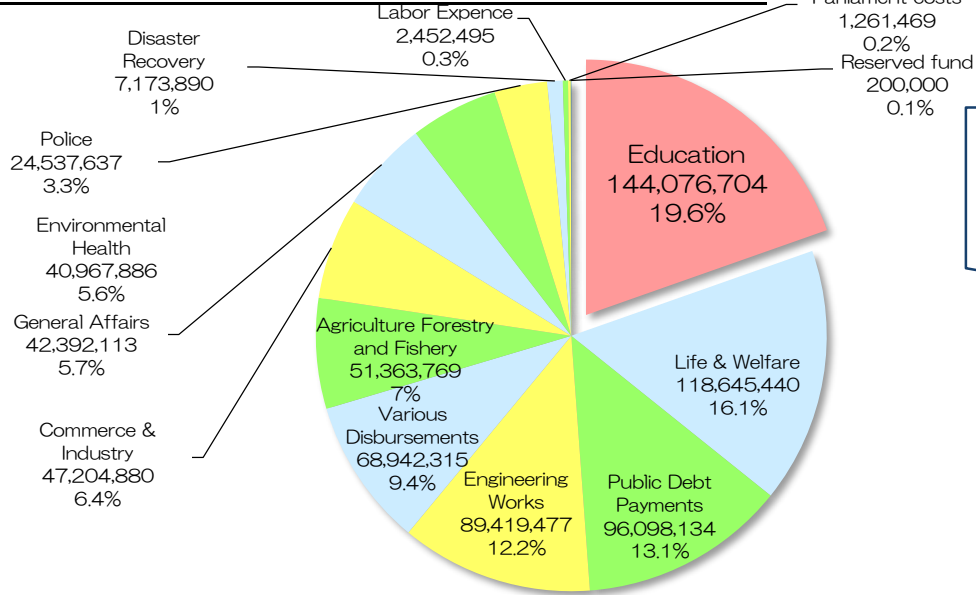

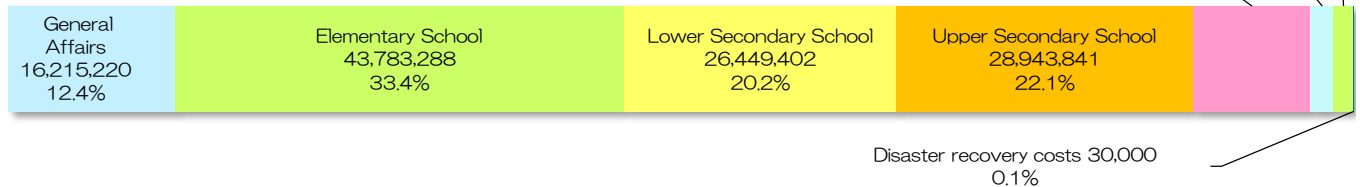

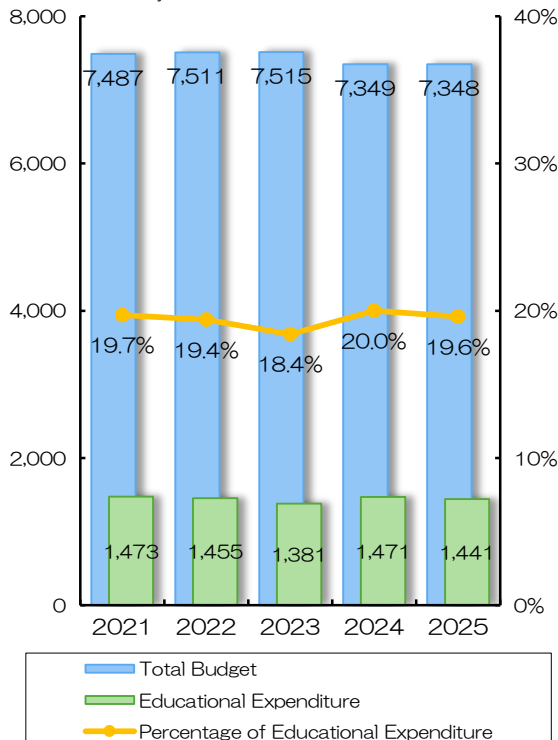

Unit: hundred million yen

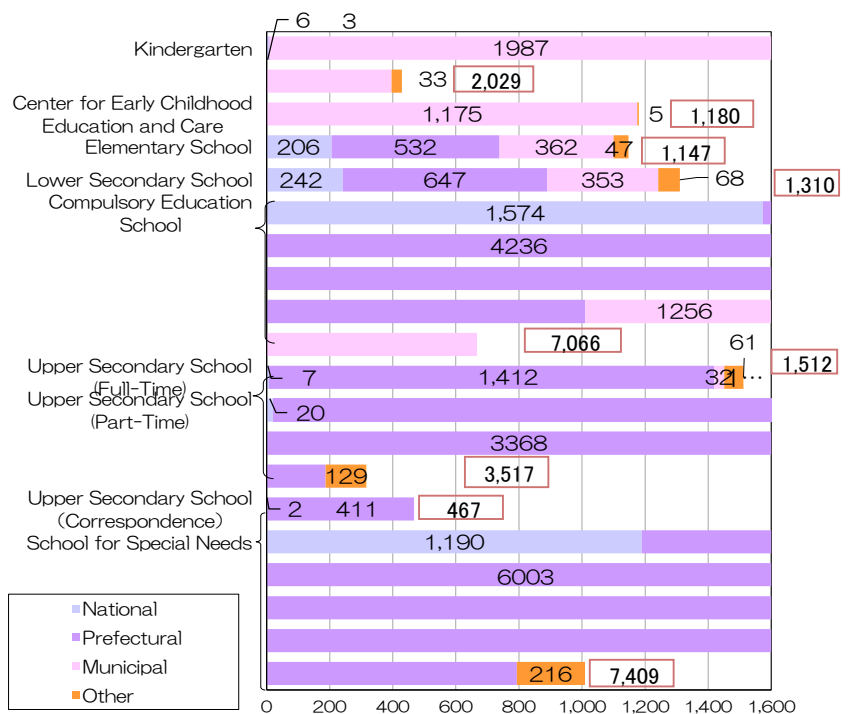


## Educational Expenditure Per Student

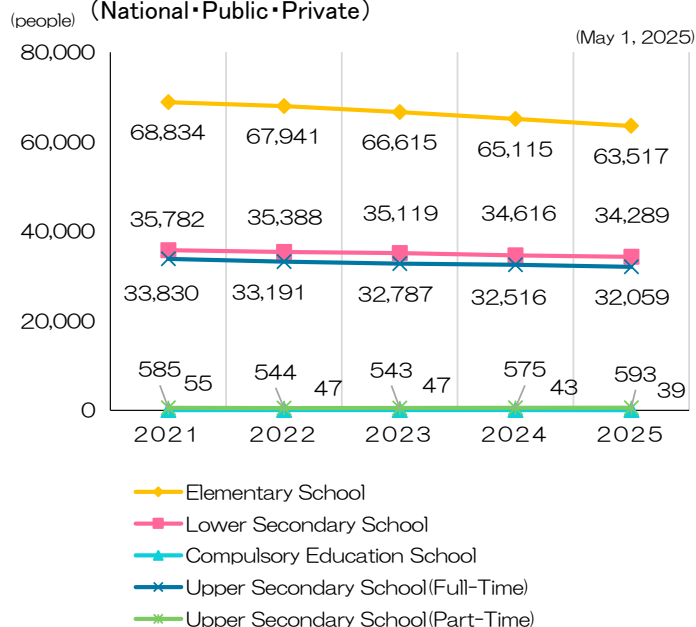

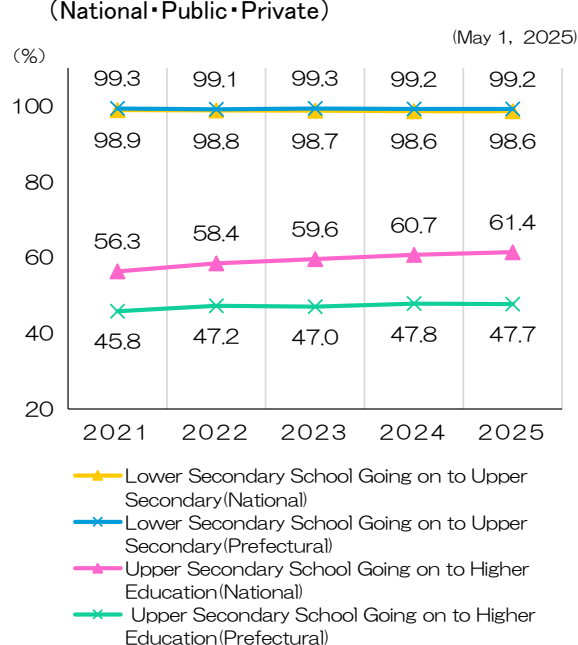

## Changes in the Number of Students (National・Public・Private)



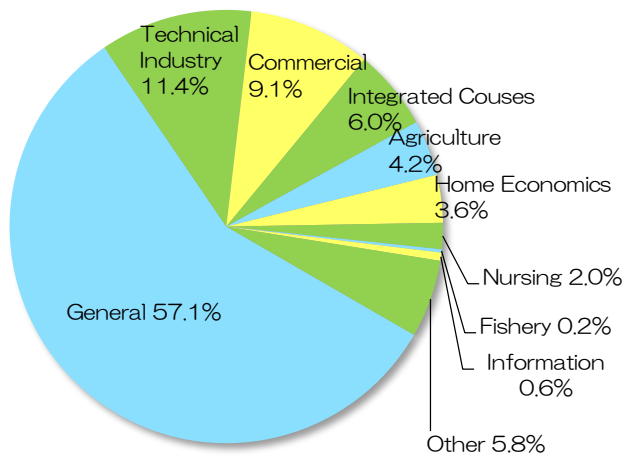
## Changes of Enrollment Rate (National・Public・Private)

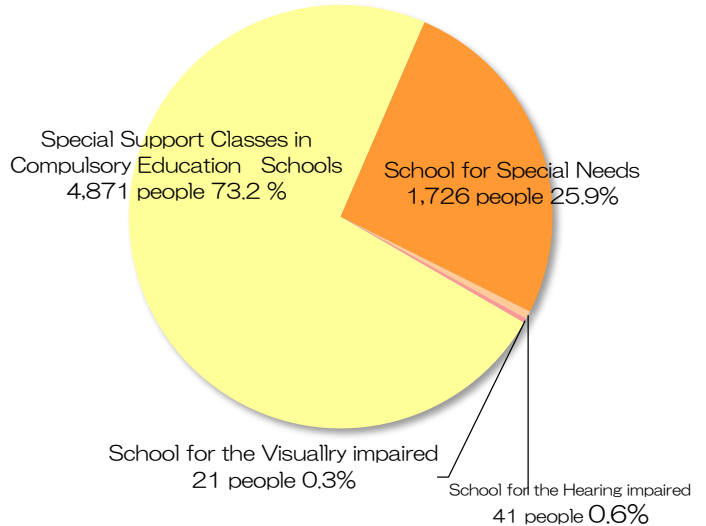

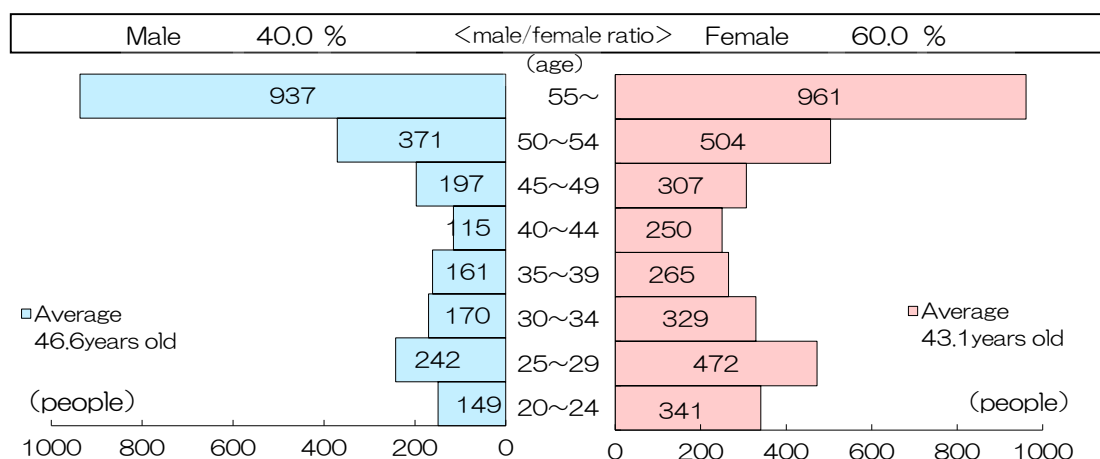

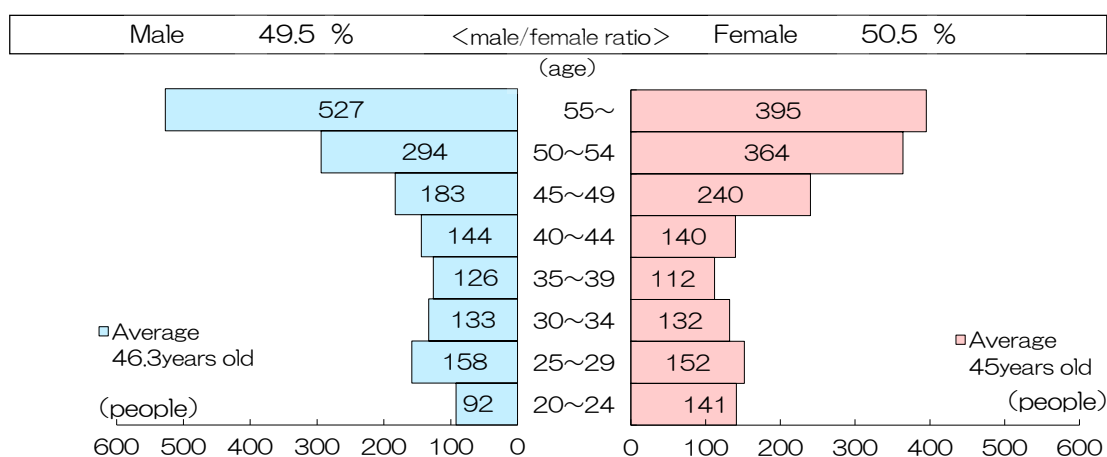
## Number of Teachers, by Age

(May 1, 2025)

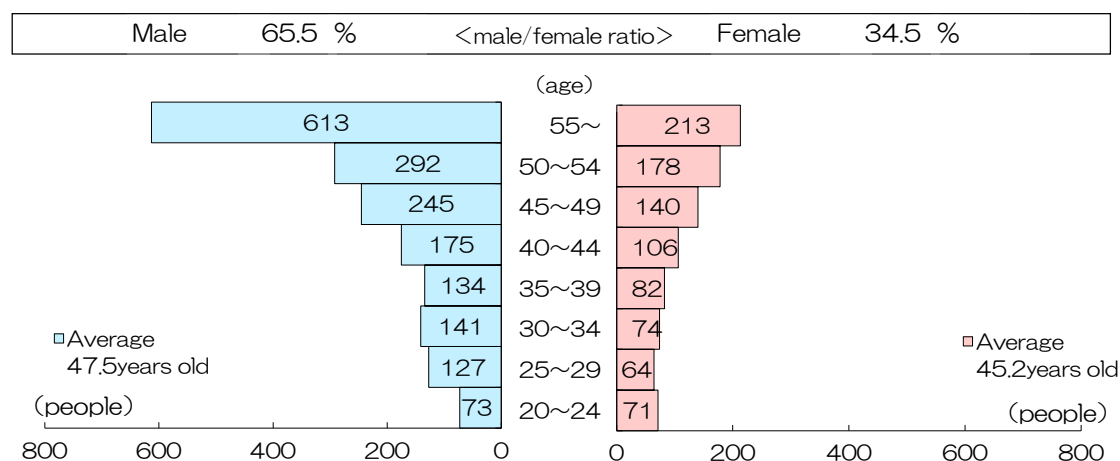

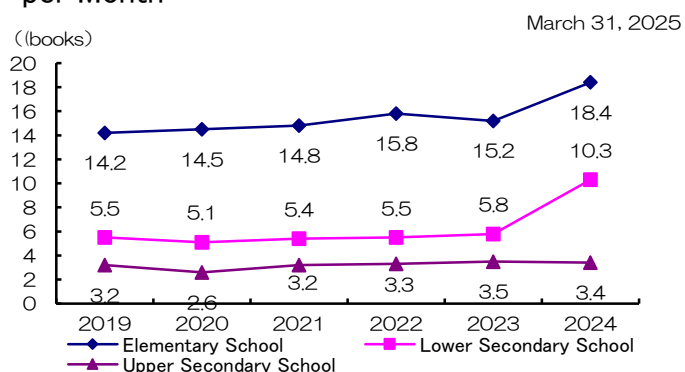

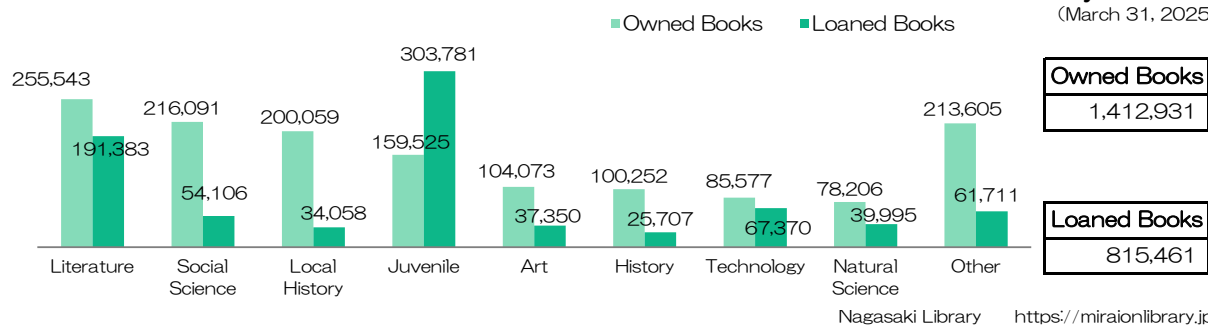

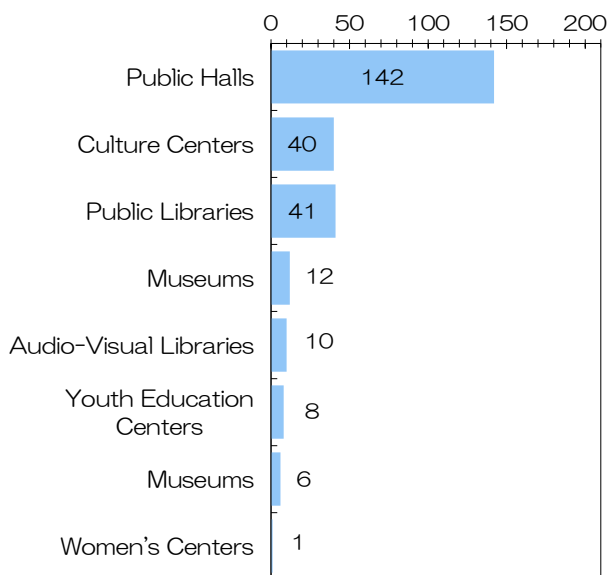
## Total Numbers of Owned and Loaned Book Statistics at the Prefectural Library

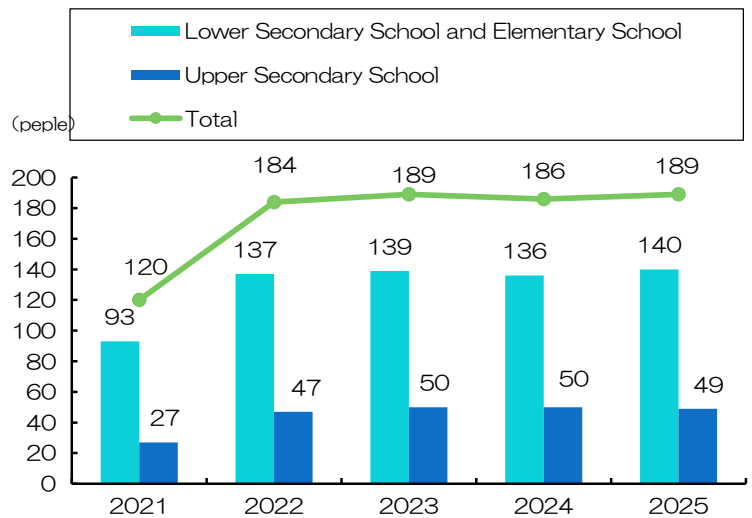

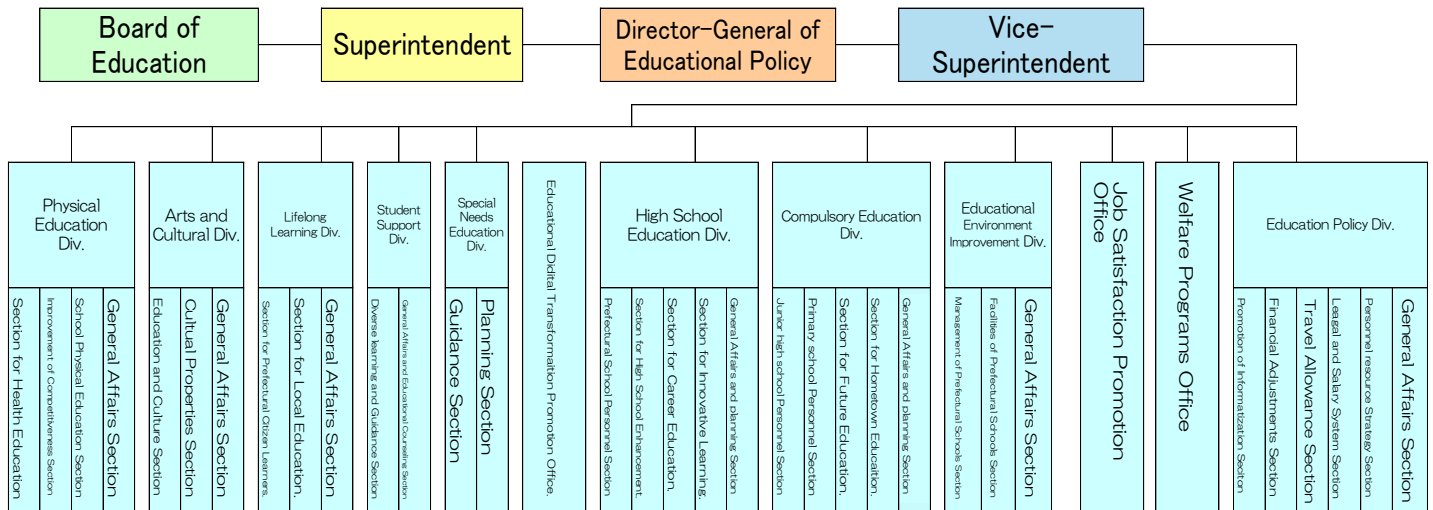
## Yearly Trend in The Number of Assistant Language Teachers
